So faithfully she worked away, she had so much to do. And always of her apron said, "I will when I get through".

And then one night with weary feet she climbed the old home stairs, and with a conquering sigh, she sat on her chair. And folding up her apron white as she was wont to do, she handed it to me and said "Well daughter, I am through".

And peacefully she entered into rest-so-nobly earned. And as the lonely years passed by, this lesson I have learned: my Mother's apron symbol was of service for her King. Now in my treasure chest it lies, a sacred, precious thing.
